

UVODNIK EDITORIAL

Inštitut Republike Slovenije za rehabilitacijo kot osrednja strokovna, pedagoška in raziskovalna rehabilitacijska ustanova na rehabilitacijskih dnevih že dvajseto leto predstavlja interdisciplinarna teoretična in s prakso pridobljena znanja iz najbolj aktualnih področij fizikalne in rehabilitacijske medicine.

Najprej enodnevna srečanja ob sobotah so že po štirih letih prerasla v dvodnevna, praviloma v drugi polovici marca, izjemoma v začetku aprila. Od leta 2005 dalje sodelujejo tudi predavatelji iz tujine.

Zborniki predavanj so vedno bolj kakovostni in letošnji je četrti, ki je izšel kot suplement Rehabilitacije, strokovne revije z recenzijo, ki jo izdaja naš Inštitut že osmo leto.

V prvem delu so objavljeni prispevki domačih predavateljev. Osebno smo povabili strokovnjake, ki naj bi v prispevkih predstavili svoje poglede na razvoj dejavnosti oziroma reševanje določenih problemov čez približno deset let.

V drugem delu zbornika so objavljeni članki aktivnih članov Evropske akademije za rehabilitacijsko medicino (Académie Européenne de Médecine de Réadaptation), ki so se zbrali prvič v Ljubljani v času 20. rehabilitacijskih dnevov, na svojem rednem spomladanskem sestanku. Med njimi sta tudi predsednik Slovenske akademije znanosti in umetnosti, akademik prof. dr. Jože Trontelj in akademik prof. dr. Tadej Bajd. Poleg njiju naj posebej omenim tudi prof. Gustaffa Lankhorsta, predsednika Evropske akademije za rehabilitacijsko medicino, prof. Alaina Delarquea, predsednika UEMS Evropskega odbora za fizikalno in rehabilitacijsko medicino, in prof. Gerolda Stuckija, bodočega predsednika Mednarodnega združenja za fizikalno in rehabilitacijsko medicino.

Vodilna tema **Rehabilitacija v prihodnosti – Rehabilitation in the Future** naj bi tako s skupnimi močmi in znanjem vseh sodelujočih dobila svojo znanstveno podlogo in usmeritve. Katedra za fizikalno in rehabilitacijsko medicino Medicinske fakultete v Ljubljani s sedežem na Inštitutu za rehabilitacijo sodeluje v organizaciji rehabilitacijskih dnevov od svoje ustanovitve 1. aprila 1997. Njena dejavnost in sodelovanje Inštituta z drugimi članicami Univerze v Ljubljani predstavlja utemeljeno podlogo za ponovno pridobitev naziva Univerzitetni inštitut za rehabilitacijo.

As the central professional, teaching and research organisation in its field in Slovenia, the Institute for Rehabilitation has been presenting interdisciplinary theory and practice from the most current topics in physical and rehabilitation medicine for twenty years.

After four years, the initial one-day meetings on Saturdays had grown into two-day meetings, which are regularly held in the second half of March, or exceptionally at the beginning of April. Since 2005, lecturers from abroad are also taking part.

Proceedings are improving in quality and this year's are the fourth consecutive Proceedings published as a supplement to Rehabilitacija, the peer-reviewed international journal that our Institute has been publishing for eight years.

The first part contains the contributions from Slovenian authors. We invited selected experts to present their views on the future developments in their respective fields of expertise and solutions to selected problems in about ten-year time.

The second part of the Proceedings brings paper from active members of the Académie Européenne de Médecine de Réadaptation (AERM, European Academy of Rehabilitation Medicine), who gathered in Ljubljana for the first time precisely during the 20th Rehabilitation Days to hold their regular spring meeting. The contributors include the President of the Slovenian Academy of Sciences and Arts, academician Prof. Jože Trontelj, and academician Prof. Tadej Bajd. Let me single out also Prof. Gustaff Lankhorst, President of the AEMR, Prof. Alain Delarque, President of the UEMS European Board for Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine, and Prof. Gerold Stucki, forthcoming President of the International Society for Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine.

*The topic of **Rehabilitation in the Future** should thus gain a scientifically based direction through the joint effort and knowledge of all participants.*

The Chair of Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine of the Faculty of Medicine in Ljubljana, which is situated at the Institute for Rehabilitation, has been co-organising the Rehabilitation Days since its founding on 1 April, 1997. Its activity and the co-operation of the Institute with other members of the University of Ljubljana provide a well-founded ground for regaining the nomination of University Institute for Rehabilitation.
